Our book departs from the basic idea, promoted by the European Union, that European public policy needs to be embedded in a European administrative space. So far, however, no one seems to know exactly whether there is a shared European administrative identity and what it looks like. The various contributions in this volume set out to explore indications of family traits of the European public servant.
